PSHE Topic this term

This half term, classes will be exploring a PSHE topic called *Bullying Matters*. In this topic, they will learn what bullying is. We define bullying behaviour as: 'repeated, negative behaviour that is intended to make others feel upset, uncomfortable or unsafe.' We make sure children understand that bullying



might be physical, verbal or indirect – such as online. The main message we share is around making sure that bullying behaviour is reported so it can be dealt with.

School Council

Our school council are always exceptionally busy coming up with ways to further improve our school. The Fundraising Council have been busy selling poppies to raise money for the British Legion, our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors have been trained up and have been working in the background to plan an assembly to launch the work they will do this year and the iVengers have been planning a new mission about Truth Seeking. The aim of the mission will be to help children spot the difference between the truth and mis or disinformation they might see online.
